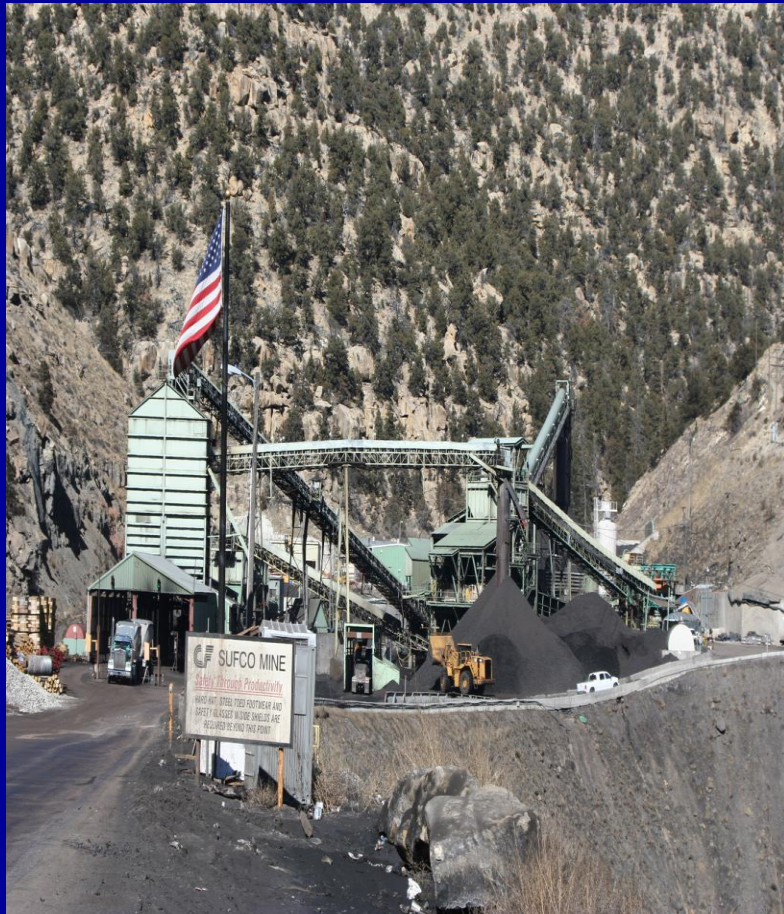

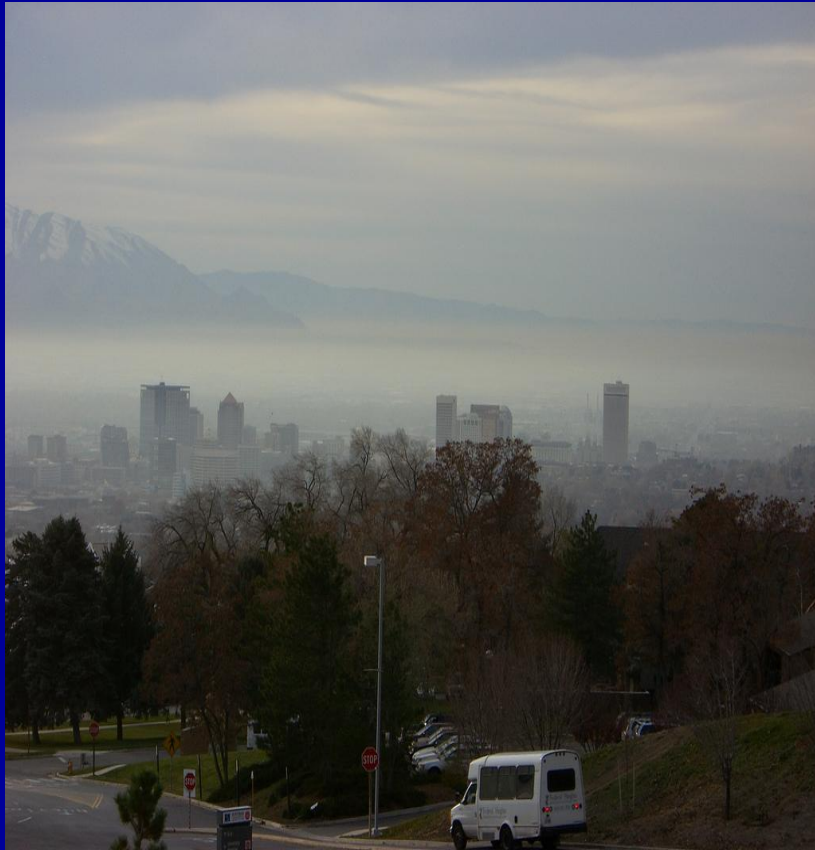
The Initiative was kicked off in June, 2010

Governor Herbert's Principles:

- Fossil fuels in Utah are critical to our economy and deserve support
- Renewable and alternative sources are also essential to our future
- Our energy must be clean and environmentally sound. Engage the “Energy Triangle”
- A free market should prevail with appropriate incentives
- Maintain Utah's relative low prices for energy
- Keep the public and energy providers continuously involved

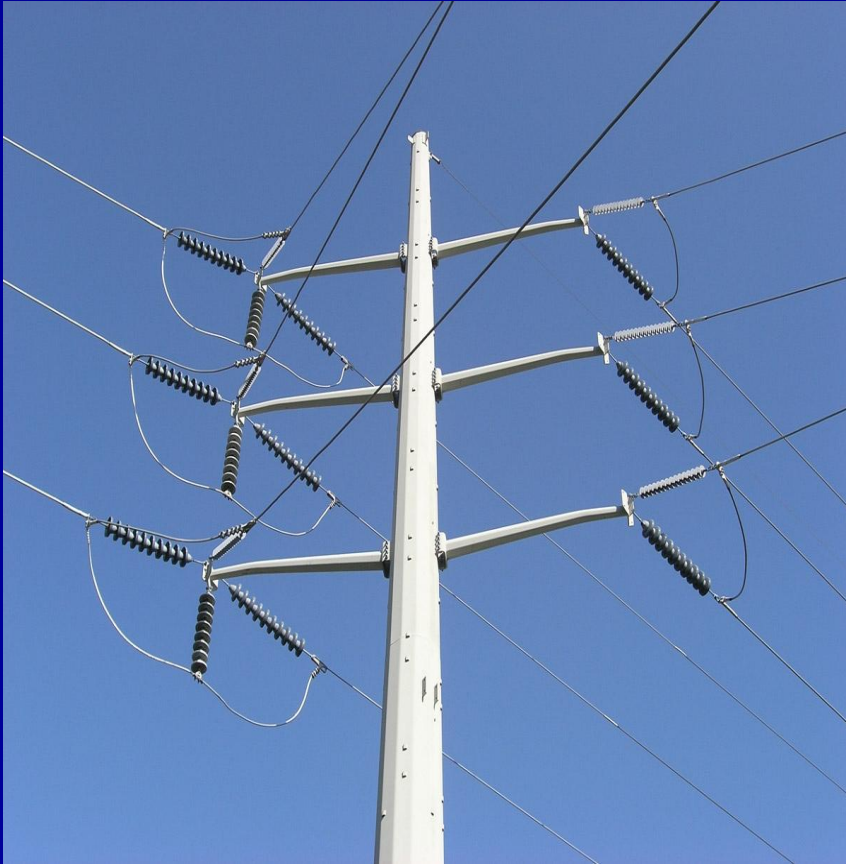


- Coal has a limited future in Utah with current long-wall technology
- A ten year plan will include support for transitions to alternative fuels such as natural gas and to renewable sources



- Don't argue the causes of climate change
Accept it and govern accordingly
